Africa4All: eParliaments, eCitizens Connecting Citizens and Parliaments of Namibia using ICT Innovative Technology

Well into the 21st century, isn't it about time we redefined the way the Parliament and Citizens of Namibia interact?

The Africa4All objective is to provide Namibia with an innovative open-source software solution, methodology and training in order to help its Parliament improve the quality, transparency and efficiency of its work and provide a mechanism for interaction with citizens. Simultaneously, the citizens will be provided with a means to become familiarized and involved with the everyday functioning of democratic decision making processes.

The purpose that the project aims to achieve is to educate and to strengthen the capacity and knowledge of MPs from Namibia to use ICT tools:

- Inter-parliamentary for their daily work
- Intra-parliamentary for sharing ideas and exchange experiences with their peers from other parliaments
- To interact with the citizens and to gather their input to legislative issues.

- To facilitate the work of MPs
- To accelerate the transition to a knowledge society and
- To increase the awareness of the Parliament activities among its citizens

The proposed online platform will be created through the customization of **Gov2DemOSS**, a platform that has already achieved international recognition and the support of the **European Union**.
